



Fishing Game

Materials

1 Cardboard Box.

Fish – use the printed sheet and print as many fish as you want.

Magnets to attach to your fish. (cost £2.95 per roll from Baker Ross)

Fishing Rods. Make a rod or just use wool or string.

Metal Paper Clips – one for each fishing rod.

Decorate your box in any way you want, print and cut out all your fish and colour or paint them. To make the fish stronger glue them onto card or cardboard (a cereal box is ideal).

Make your fishing rods out of something long and strong. Don't worry if you do not have anything suitable you can just use a long piece of wool or string.

Attach a metal paper clip to the end of your string or wool. Tie or glue the string to the end of each rod.

Number each of your fish with random numbers – some bigger and some smaller. Small magnets can be found online to purchase.

Put all your fish into the box.

You are now ready to start playing the game.

Rules.

Each player takes their turn to fish. If they catch a fish they allow the next person to have their go, continue around the players until the last fish has been caught – the winner is the one that has the highest number when every number on each of their fish has been added up.

Each player has **30 seconds** to catch a fish then they must stand back even if they have not caught anything.

*Remember the rule is you add all the numbers on the fish together for each player to find out the winner **NOT** the number of fish caught by each player.*
