POUND COIN KEYRING POUCH

Have you ever got to the supermarket and found you have no pound coin for the trolly? Don't worry, you are not alone, most of us are the same. This simple but very useful coin pouch keyring will stop the problem and it is so simple to make.

Materials

Felt or thick suitable material such as Denham.

Velcro.

Keyring attachment.

Needle and Cotton – I have used embroidery thread as this makes a nice contrasting colour and is strong and long lasting.

<u>Instructions</u>

Front – Measure 3cm x 3cm square and cut out.

Back – Measure 3cm width x 7cm length and cut out.

- 1. Cut the fluffy side of your Velcro to the required size but make sure you do not attach it over your sewing edges, and sew it to the outside of the small square of felt near the bottom edge but above the sewing line.
- 2. With the Velcro side facing you put the small square on the front of the larger piece of felt, placing it at the bottom edge to form a pocket. Hand sew all around 3 sides leaving the top open. Over-stitching makes the seems neater but use any stitch you like.
- 3. Now fold the top down to form a flap and attach the same size piece of the rough Velcro to the inside of the flap positioning it accurately to keep the coin safe.
- 4. Sew the finished pouch to your keyring attachment and add it to your keys or inside a handbag. Replace your coin inside the pouch every time you put your shopping trolly back in the bay and you will never again have to go looking for a pound coin.
